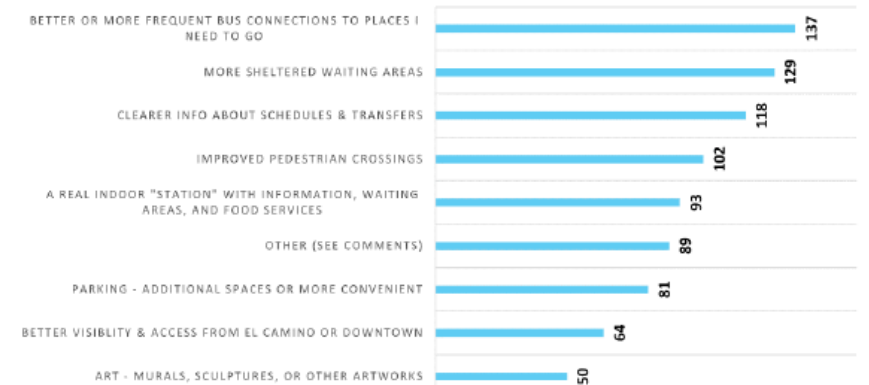

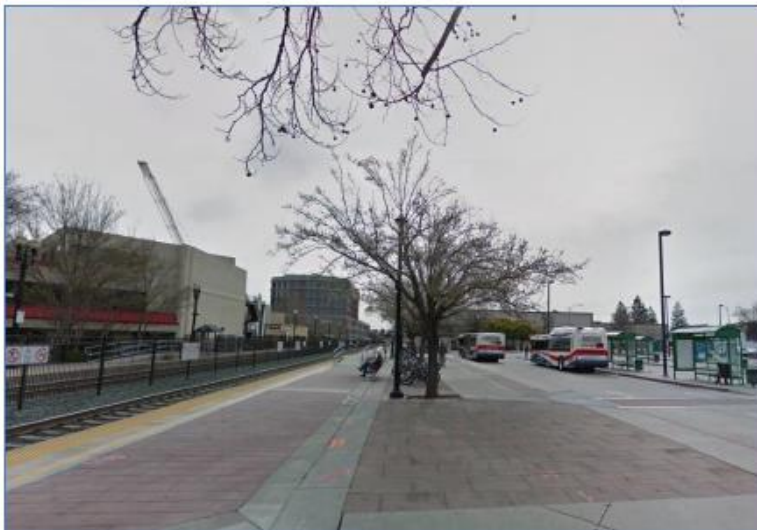

Potential Station Relocation

- 1 Accommodate potential rail uses (HSR & Dumbarton)
- 2 All transit in one area
- 3 Linear bus circulation
- 4 Drop-off for ride-sharing services
- 5 Potential for improved connections to downtown and adjacent areas
