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Dear Ms. Leung,

I am extremely concerned that project changes which are too large to be called minor modifications are being rushed through without the full appropriate documents available to the public for review (as required) and without adequate time for comments from neighbors.

- The County's ordinance says changes to grading permits that big must be approved by the Board of Supervisors, because they were the ones to originally approve it.
- This must go before the Board!

Regarding San Mateo County's notification letter dated May 3 with subject "Consideration of a proposed Minor Modification to an approved Resource Management (RM) Permit (PLN2006-00357) for the development of Lots 5, 6, 7, and 8 (BLD2016-00161 through BLD2016-00164) in the San Mateo Highlands Area", because of the significant impact this construction project will have to the hillside along Ticonderoga Drive, which includes a possible increased risk of a landslide in the area, and the significant changes, 2x the amount of hauling, to the originally proposed earth grading activity, I request that the County prepare a supplemental environmental impact report document, give adequate time to review and comment on the full collection of documents and bring the developer's request to the Board of Supervisors.

This community has worked for years in good faith and expect the same in return from the developer.
